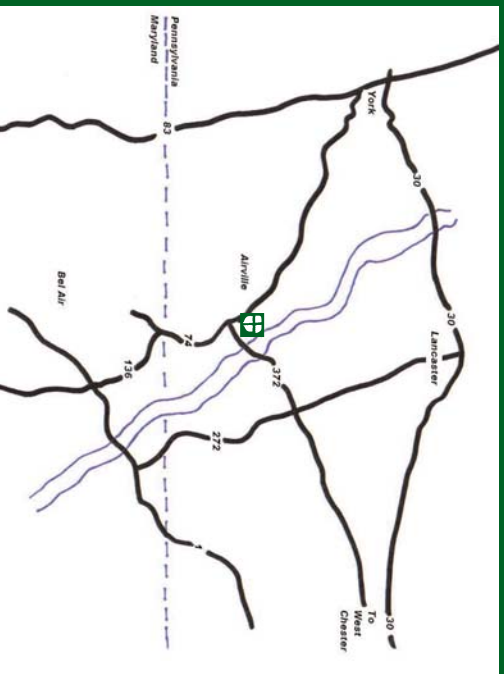

How to Get to Camp Donegal



From York County: Follow Rte. 74 south through Airville to Sunnyburn (approx. 3 miles south of Airville). After you pass Bethany Baptist Church on your right, make the next left onto Telegraph Road. (If you reach Rte. 372 you've gone 1 mile too far on Rte. 74). Travel 1.2 miles to the Camp Donegal entrance on your left.

From Chester County: Follow Rte. 1 south to Rte. 472, Oxford (2 exits before MD line). Follow Rte. 472 north 12 miles to Rte. 372 in Quarryville. Turn left onto Rte. 372 west. Follow Rte. 372 west approx. 15 miles across the Susquehanna River to "T" intersection at Rte. 74. Turn right onto Rte. 74 north and travel approx. 1 mile to third road on right, Telegraph Road. Turn right onto Telegraph Road and travel 1.2 miles to the Camp Donegal entrance on your left.

From Lancaster County: Follow Rte. 272 South to Rte. 372 at the Buck. Turn right onto Rte. 372 west. Follow Rte. 372 west approx. 10 miles across the Susquehanna River to "T" intersection at Rte. 74. Turn right onto Rte. 74 north and travel approx. 1 mile to third road on right, Telegraph Road. Turn right onto Telegraph Road and travel 1.2 miles to the Camp Donegal entrance on your left.

Camp Donegal is located 7 miles north of the Pennsylvania/Maryland border on the west shore of the Susquehanna River. While the location has a marvelously remote feel to it, Camp Donegal is only 1-1/4 miles from the main road and easily accessible from York, Lancaster, and Chester Counties, as well as from northern Maryland.

Our Site:

Nestled in the rolling hills on the west shore of the Susquehanna River in south central Pennsylvania are 128 acres of woods, fields and tumbling brooks. In this setting, the rustic lodges, cabins, wilderness shelters, swimming pool and other facilities of Camp Donegal combine to make it the "growing place" for outdoor ministry.



Donegal Hall: This facility is the hub of summer camp life at Donegal. Donegal Hall is our dining hall, our registration center, our pick-up area, and our general gathering space.

Reformation Cabins: Built in 1957 as the original structures of Camp Donegal, these four cabins house 16 people each on bunk beds, divided between two bedrooms with their own indoor bath facilities.



Barmen Lodge: This recently renovated retreat center was built in 1971 and houses 32 people. The upstairs is divided into two separate bedrooms, each with its own bath facility. The downstairs greatroom and second floor wrap around porch add to this building's charm.

Wilderness: This cluster of four three-sided adirondack shelters provides housing for up to 26 campers. Complete with a bath house and pavilion with running water but no electricity, this area of the camp allows true escape from the hustle and bustle of everyday life.



Koinonia Pavilion: This picnic pavilion is complete with electricity and water with nearby bath facilities. Koinonia Pavilion is the site for our Day Camp, and is also used for other camp activities on weeks when Day Camp is not in session.

Elim Pool: Our 2.5 to 5.5 foot deep in-ground pool offers a spacious shallow end to accommodate small children and plenty of deeper water for swimmers to enjoy. A life-guard is on duty at all times during summer camp.



Our Theme: Changed by Love

"So we know that God loves us. We depend on it. God is love. Anyone who leads a life of love shows that he is joined to God. And God is joined to him."

--1 John 4:16, NIV

God's love is transforming. Throughout the Bible we encounter stories of people, of families, of communities, of the world, and of the Kingdom being changed by the love of God. This is a theme about the transforming power of God's love. Campers will go home at the end of their time at camp knowing with absolute certainty that God can and does transform their individual lives, and that this transformation can and will, in turn, transform the Kingdom. It's never just about us as individuals.

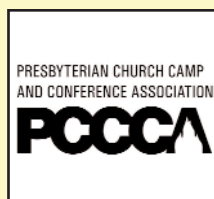

General Information

Scholarships:

Many local churches provide financial help to youth from their congregations who wish to attend camp. If you need financial aid, contact your church. If the local church is unable to respond, contact the camp office. Camp Donegal has a limited scholarship fund to assist youth unable to secure financial help from their churches.

Early Bird Discount:

Campers who pay their ENTIRE camp fee by May 16, 2010 may deduct \$35 per person per camp from the stated fee. PAYMENT MUST BE IN FULL AND POST-MARKED NO LATER THAN MAY 16, 2010. The Early Bird discount does not apply to Family Camp.

Multiple Camp Discount:

For campers registering for more than one camp, a 10% discount will be applied to the least expensive camp. This discount applies only to individual campers, not siblings.

First Time Family Discount:

To encourage new families to experience our Family Camp ministry, Camp Donegal is offering a special "First Time Family Discount" to new camping families enrolling for a Family Camp Weekend. Your family is eligible for a \$5 per person (up to \$40 per family) discount.

Grade Levels:

Grade levels listed in this brochure indicate grade completed by the end of the 2008/2009 school year. Camp Donegal is flexible in placing campers. We encourage you to call the camp office to discuss your special circumstances.

Refunds:

Camp fees are refundable, less a \$100 processing fee, or fully transferable towards another camp up to 48 hours prior to the start of your camp. Please contact the camp office as soon as possible if you need to make a change to your registration.
